MEETING MILESTONES

ON SITE AT KINGSGROVE

Works continue to progress on site at Kingsgrove, with big milestones being achieved in the first few months of this year.

The easterly-most phase, known as Yellow Fields, has been bought by Bellway, who are already working on site on the Greensands phase. They are due to start on site on this new phase of housing in October this year.

Another landmark in the development was the sale of the 1.1 acre plot consented for a care home to Care UK in February this year. Alongside the delivery and opening of the new GEMS Wantage Primary Academy and plans progressing on the public square Art Commission (see p.2 for info), the sale of the care home site is the next milestone in cultivating a new intergenerational community at the heart of Kingsgrove.





As we now have 150 occupations in Kingsgrove, St. Modwen is providing the town council with S106 funding to help support community development initiatives in the wider area, as well as funding for public transport and the upkeep of Betjeman Park.

KINGSGROVE ARTS

COMMISSIONED ARTIST

Over the last year, St. Modwen has been on the lookout for an artist to bring public art into the neighbourhood centre at Kingsgrove.

At the beginning of March, the Kingsrove Art Commission steering group chose Kerry Lemon, experienced public artist, museum lover, botanicals enthusiast and teacher, to help them achieve this vision.

Kerry has been commissioned to create a series of permanent sculptural works inspired by the heritage of Kingsgrove, that aid in wayfinding and help make the public square and park a place to enjoy.

"I want to create encounters with art which surprise and delight, so will make this work interactive to encourage play, learning and exploration."

Kerry will be engaging with local groups to ensure that the people that live in Kingsgrove have the opportunity to shape the art they will see every day.






LOVE KINGSGROVE PHOTO COMPETITION
